## Pet Food Assistance

In 2021 Heart2Heart helped pet owners with pet food assistance. We provide small bags of dog and cat food to the Hamilton Little Free Pantry. When a H2H supporter offered space on her north side property for our own little pet food pantry, another friend built and installed it. Both pantries are stocked weekly. Heart2Heart also helped at the Hunger Task Force food distributions once a month to give out dog and cat food.

## Happy Hearts

When David's guinea pig, Annie, started limping a visit to the veterinarian uncovered swelling and soft tissue injury but no broken bones. With Heart2Heart's help Annie was treated and made a full recovery.

Carrie's cat, Arthur, was having trouble breathing, his nose was swelling, he was hiding, and not eating well. The vet found nasal polyps and surgery to remove the polyps went very well! Arthur is recovering well, breathing comfortably, and eating like a healthy cat.

## Help Securing Housing

The help Heart2Heart can give is small in the big picture of homelessness, but in 2021 we believe it made a difference to these and other pet owners.

Barbara was homeless and had a chance to get shelter but was not going to give up her pup Ferdinand. Thanks to our donors, Ferdi was able to get the vaccinations and medical treatment he needed, so that both could have access to shelter and stay together.

Homeless with three adored cats, Stephe had the opportunity to move from a homeless shelter to permanent housing. With help from Heart2Heart her cats, Drake, Carla, and Moonbeam got vaccinated and licensed and were able to make the move with Stephe.
